

# Fruit Fly Trap – Never Fails!

Always Works!

These fruit fly traps always seem to work best. I've tried other baits. Saran wrap but these really do the trick, catching all the local fruit flies.

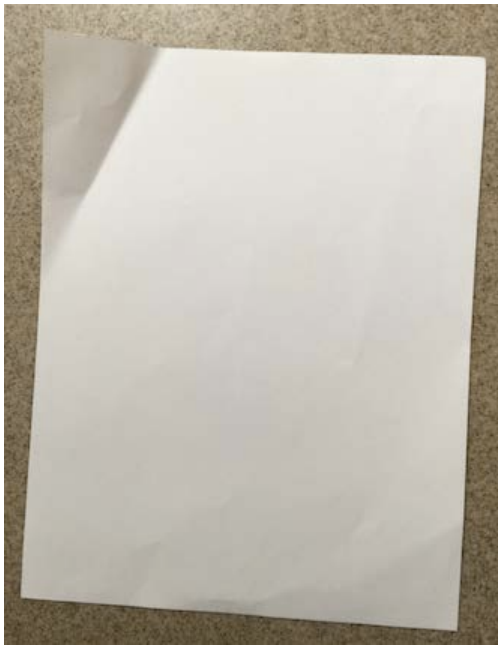
Parts:

1. Disposable Cup – 16 ounce size but any cup will do
2. One(1) sheet of 8.5 x 11 copy/computer paper
3. Scissors
4. Scotch Tape
5. Banana –5 or 6 slices for 'bait' – ones turning brown or even going 'mushy' are good, but any banana will do, as they will age quickly once cut into a few slices.

Process:

1. Fold paper into a cone on long end, bringing ends together, and tape edge
2. Cut bottom of cone with a small 1/8 inch hole.. Just big enough for fruit fly to enter...this basically will work like a 'lobster trap'
3. Place some cut up pieces of banana in the disposable cup
4. Place cone of paper inverted (cone facing down) into cup and center
5. Use a few pieces of tape to hold cone in place... then cut off top of the cone to make it symmetrical, about 1 inch above top of cup
6. Completely tape the rest of the cone to the cup
7. That's it! Now place cup strategically near your fruit or wherever fruit flies have been observed. Cup fills with flies. .When ready to dispose, just throw "outside" in garbage!

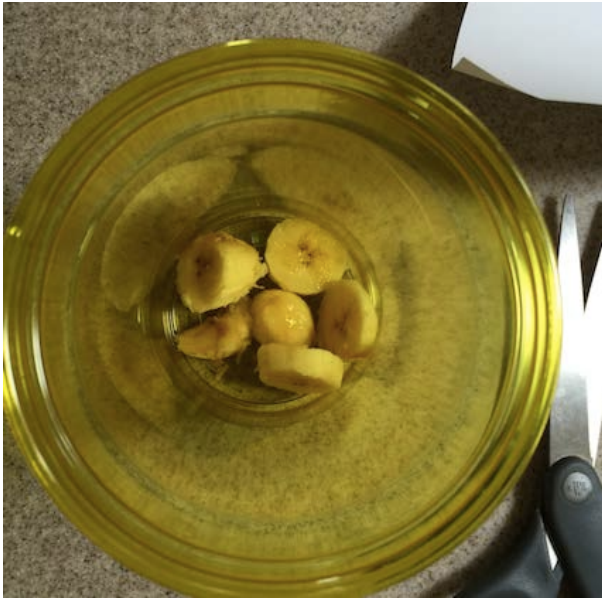
# 1. Paper – One Computer Sheet turned into cone for “entrance”



2. Complete the Paper Cone, taping the sides that connect, and cutting entrance Hole in bottom of cone



3. Bait the disposable cup, then place cone inverted into cup, and use a few pieces of tape to hold in place



4. Complete trap: Cut top of cone about one inch above cup, (discard top of paper cut off to make cone even) and then complete taping the cone to the cup.





Here's a completed trap – view from top and entrance hole, and results from a couple days of trapping!
